As educational systems increasingly focus on cognitive development, Islamic education uniquely incorporates the holistic development of the individual nurturing both intellect and morals, which is essential in Islamic teachings (Fandir, 2024). Early childhood education, in particular, is recognized as critical in laying the foundation for lifelong beliefs, values, and behaviors. The Qur'an's teachings, especially Surah Luqman, offer profound

wisdom on how to raise children in alignment with these values. The Surah emphasizes critical values such as Tawhid (oneness of Allah), humility, respect for parents, and moral conduct core principles in the upbringing of a devout Muslim.

In the face of modern challenges, such as the influence of globalization and technological advances, these values become increasingly important. Globalization, as Suroso et al. (2021) point out, brings both opportunities and threats, as young people are exposed to a variety of cultural and ideological influences that can sometimes conflict with Islamic principles. Surah Luqman provides a framework for addressing these challenges by offering guidance that nurtures young Muslims both spiritually and morally, ensuring that they stay grounded in their Islamic identity despite external pressures. According to Tolchah and Mu'ammam (2019), integrating these traditional teachings into the rapidly changing socio-cultural and technological environments presents a unique challenge but is crucial for sustaining Islamic values among youth.

The lessons found in Surah Luqman, particularly verses 12-19, offer a comprehensive approach to raising children who are not only knowledgeable about their faith but also exhibit good character. Meli (2019) argues that these verses are foundational for character development, especially in fostering values such as respect for elders, humility, and piety. These teachings are practical and directly applicable to everyday life, making them highly relevant in contemporary educational contexts. This Surah's emphasis on moral character provides valuable guidance for Muslim educators, who aim to prepare students for the ethical challenges they will face in a rapidly changing world.

The role of parents in imparting these lessons cannot be overstated. Zahro et al. (2024) highlight that parents are the primary educators and role models for their children, and they are directly responsible for instilling values such as gratitude, respect, and humility, as demonstrated in Surah Luqman. Islamic parenting, grounded in love, patience, and guidance, is central to the effective transmission of these values. As Sholihah and Nurhayati (2022) assert, the role of parents in providing both emotional support and moral guidance is essential in helping children internalize the teachings of Islam and avoid the negative influences of secular society.

In addition, the influence of digital media on youth today cannot be ignored. As Firman and Ni'mah (2023) argue, the proliferation of digital technologies has brought significant changes to the way youth engage with information and form their beliefs. The role of Islamic education now extends beyond the classroom, requiring educators and parents to incorporate Surah Luqman's teachings into the digital education sphere. As El-Mubarak and Hassan (2021) point out, adapting Islamic education to the digital age while maintaining its moral integrity is critical to sustaining the faith among the younger generation. Integrating the moral lessons of Surah Luqman into e-learning platforms and digital resources provides an opportunity to engage students in a way that resonates with their digital experience.

Furthermore, Islamic boarding schools (pesantren) have historically played a significant role in integrating traditional Islamic teachings with modern educational practices. As Asror et al. (2023) suggest, pesantren have been able to balance traditional methods of religious education with contemporary pedagogical techniques, ensuring that students receive both intellectual and moral education. This approach aligns with the principles outlined in Surah Luqman, particularly in its focus on nurturing moral integrity

alongside academic excellence. By incorporating the teachings of Surah Luqman, pesantren provide a model for how Islamic education can evolve to meet the needs of the 21st century while remaining firmly grounded in traditional Islamic values.

In conclusion, Surah Luqman offers a comprehensive and adaptable framework for Islamic education, addressing both the intellectual and moral development of young Muslims.
